

Abbreviated History of the Hall-Fowler Home

 Built in 1870 as the private residence of Mayor Frederick Hall

> Gifted in 1903 to the City of Ionia by his daughter, Marion Hall



- The Deed and Building Use powers still reside with the City; the library is only a lessee
 - 1965 is the first mention in the archives of the building being obsolete for library purposes


Short History of The Independent Library District

- 1903 Founded as a city department; the Hall-Fowler Memorial Library
 - 1997 Joined the Ionia County Library Association (ICLA)
 - ▶ 1998 Voters approve ICLA County-wide Operating Millage
 - 2003 County Millage vote leads to the creation of an Independent Library District [Founding members: City of Ionia, Easton Twp., Ionia Public Schools, Ionia Twp. (2008 – reduced to 86%)]
 - 2004 Hall-Fowler Deed does not follow to the District Library; Lease only \$1.00 per year but the district is responsible for operating & maintenance expenses
 - 2000's Decade Three Library improvement plans aborted [2001] or defeated
 [2005 & 2007]
 - 2016 Electorate renews millage and approves a 33% increase to the operating budget (restores funding to pre-2008 levels)
