Our theme this year is going to be Advocacy and Parent Leadership so we started by talking about their family's rights in the Early On program, we passed out a one sheet with information about those rights and went over them as a group.

We asked the group if they remembered getting the rights flyer and most of them did, but many of them did not remember going over it with their provider. A few of the parents suggested sharing it after the first visit when things are more settled, and also going over it again at the 6 month review. Another parent suggested doing a rights video.

We also talked about how families are able to receive Early On services outside their homes and whether that option had been presented to them. Most parents did not know that was a possibility so we talked about what that could look like and encouraged them to ask their providers about it. Other Comments:

We talked about how families are matched with their providers.

One parent mentioned how she used the contact info in the newsletter to switch to a different provider.
